# Forgiveness And Restoration

1 John 1:9

### Relationship vs. Fellowship

Proverbs 28:13

What happens if we wait or keep repeating sin without confessing it to God, our heart will become hardened towards Him— we won't be sorry

about it anymore. When struggling with a habit or addiction, we are not being hypocritical when we confess that sin each time we commit it, as long as we are sincere in our attempts to overcome it by



God's grace and through our faith in His Word. We are never a failure until we give up. Concerning forgiveness Jesus said the following:

"Then Peter came to Him and said, 'Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? Up to seven times?' Jesus said to him, 'I do not say to you, up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven."

Matthew 18:21-22

#### The Faithfulness of God

You know God practices what He preaches! So if He tells us to forgive someone (490 times) in the same day; so many times that we lose count, how much more will God forgive us when we confess our sins to Him with a sincere heart. Besides, our mistakes are no surprise to God anyway. When

Adam and Eve disobeyed God in the Garden of Eden, He already knew that was going to happen. The Lord gave them a



chance to repent, instead they made excuses and blamed each other. Friend, let's be honest with God, ourselves and others. It takes humility to admit that we made mistakes, but that's the only way we are going to get forgiven and restored.

"Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need."

Hebrews 4:16

So let's not run from our Heavenly Father, let's run to Him, even when we are faithless, He remains faithful—He'll never leave us or forsake us.
